



THE FLORIDA FILM FESTIVAL INVADES DOWNTOWN ORLANDO

*Florida Theatrical Association Announced as Sponsor;
New Box Office Location Opens December 3*

Orlando, FL – (Dec. 2, 2007) – Florida Theatrical Association, the non-profit presenter of national touring Broadway productions in Orlando, has teamed up with ENZIAN as a participating sponsor of the Florida Film Festival, offering the first-ever official box office location in downtown Orlando in the Festival's 17 year history.

The new Florida Film Festival box office at 301 East Pine Street, Suite 175 in the American Momentum building -- across from Sam Sneads -- is scheduled to open on Monday, Dec. 3 and will operate Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The same office will continue to serve as the present ticketing location for Orlando's touring Broadway shows.
